The Elk Rapids Police Department is committed to the safety and education of our school students and as such, the department offers the T.E.A.M. School Liaison Program.

The Teaching, Educating, And Mentoring (T.E.A.M.) School Liaison Program is a school based "law related" curriculum taught to grades K – 12 by specially trained Officer Chuck Horn.

The T.E.A.M. School Liaison Program goal is to unite educators, students and law enforcement to become an integral part in the prevention of crime. The philosophy is that while working together as a team we can create relationships and be united in protecting children from becoming victims of crime. T.E.A.M. is flexible and adaptable and can be used as a stand-alone program for assemblies, special events, or instructed in a consecutive sequence. The curriculum at elementary, middle school, and high school provides students with a thorough understanding of laws and their responsibility as a citizen to obey laws. The newest T.E.A.M. curriculum lesson plan introduces students to the importance of "Homeland Security" and their role in "Family Preparedness".
